

Hautapu School Pool Conditions of Use

The Hautapu School Board of Trustees will allow the school pool at Hautapu school to be used under the following conditions:

- 1. Any person entering this swimming pool area and using the facilities located in this area are advised by virtue of this notice that they are utilising such facilities entirely at their own risk and that they are fully aware that there are no lifesaving facilities of any nature provided and therefore indemnify the owners of this facility, the School, its Board of Trustees or the pool volunteer caretakers in full under the laws of New Zealand (which apply to all users of this facility) and shall have no claim of whatsoever nature against the owners, the School, its Board of Trustees or the pool volunteer caretakers including any claim from any injury/bodily harm/death and/or loss of property which could arise from the use of this facility.
 - a) Any serious accident or near miss must be reported to the school.
- 2. The pool may be used from the day they are opened until closed for the season (End of Term 1, 2025). Times: daily, except during the hours when school is in session and learn to swim programmes are in session.
- 3. At all times there must be an adult (16 years of age or older) in attendance at the pool supervising those swimmers for whom they are responsible.
 - a) Children under eight years of age must be actively supervised at all times by an adult in the water beside them or at the pool edge beside them

Non-keyholders who might arrive to swim when you are at the pool, are not permitted to enter.

- 4. The keyholder must not permit any person to damage or interfere with the school grounds, pool and all fixtures and fittings. The keyholder will be responsible for any damage.
- 5. The Board of Trustees or staff are not required to supervise at the pool during the above times.
- 6. The keyholder will ensure that all those using the pool abide by the rules as listed below:
 - a. No person is to swim alone and a person who is 16 years of age(minimum) must personally supervise swimmers.
 - b. Never swim under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
 - c. The keyholder is responsible for designating at least one person (16 years old or older) as supervisor while in the pool complex.
 - d. No running on concrete areas. No dive-bombing into pool.
 - e. No dangerous play that may cause injury or interference with others' pleasure.
 - f. All school property must be treated with respect.
 - g. All rubbish to be taken with you.
 - h. The pool gate to be left securely closed at all times.
 - i. No food or drink within the pool enclosure.
 - j. No glass permitted in the pool area.
 - k. When leaving the pool the keyholder is responsible for seeing that the changing sheds and toilet are in a clean and tidy state and that the **Gate** is **locked**.
 - I. **No** Alcohol is to be consumed at Hautapu School, this includes but is not limited to the pool area unless prior permission is sought by the Board of Trustees in writing.

7. Pool hygiene

- a) To avoid spreading illness (e.g. those caused by *Cryptosporidium, Giardia, E. coli*, or norovirus), anyone who has had diarrhoea must not use the pool until two weeks after their symptoms have resolved. This is Ministry of Health advice and a requirement of Water Quality Standard NZS 5826:2010.
- b) Pool users are encouraged to use the toilet before swimming. Children who are not toilet trained must wear a swim nappy.
- c) In the event of a faecal accident, diarrhoea, or vomiting in the pool, the pool will be closed until the water quality is tested and restored

Special Note

- I. The keyholder is responsible for the actions of all in his/her group.
- II. The keyholder is to supply their own first aid kit.
- III. This key is not to be lent to any other party (one key = one family)
- IV. This key is to be returned to school by end of Term 1, 2025 (11th April 2025)
- V. The Board of Trustees members, staff and pool volunteer caretakers will evict anyone who does not abide by the rules and may ask for the key to be returned

Any persistent offenders will be banned from the pool.
